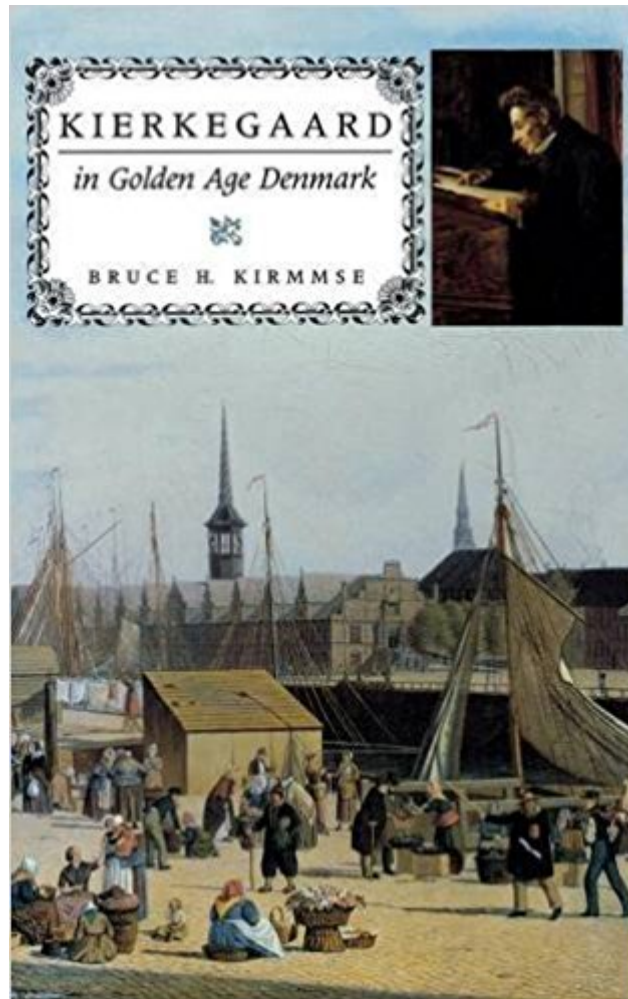


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Kierkegaard In Golden Age Denmark (Indiana Series In The Philosophy Of Religion)

Kirmmse's book is an attempt to place Kierkegaard in the Political, social and religious context of early 19th century Danish Society. There are chapters on the major characters constantly referred to in SK's book. There are chapters on Grundtvig, Martensen, Heiberg and, of course, Mynster. The major emphasis in his discussion of SK, himself is: why was *Concluding Unscientific Postscript* not his last book as he planned it to be? The second half of the book is a wonderful exploration of the "second authorship." a great read.

Bruce Kirmmse is one of the best Kierkegaard-scholars in the world, and this book proves it. He knows Copenhagen, Denmark, and he knows Kierkegaard very well. His book provides a very clear description of the social, political & cultural background of SK's life and work. It's very wise to study "Golden Age Denmark" for exploring the meaning of SK's works. Very high standard. Also many years after first edition (1990) it is still a very good book about Kierkegaard's world and introduction to his main works (SuD, WL, TiC, CDs, et al.). I think, it should be translated too (German, French, Italian, Korean, Japanese?), and p.525pp bibliographically updated.

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
